Motorist Awareness

Welcome to MAY!!!

In recognition of National Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month, the National Safety Council reminds riders – and drivers – to do their part in sharing the road.

Safe riding practices and cooperation from all road users will help reduce the number of fatalities and injuries on our nation's highways. But it's especially important for motorists to understand the safety challenges faced by motor-cyclists such as size and visibility, and motorcycle riding practices like down-shifting and weaving to know how to anticipate and respond to them. By raising motorist's awareness, both drivers and riders will be safer sharing the road.

If you ride a motorcycle, you already know how much fun riding can be. You understand the exhilaration of cruising the open road and the challenge of controlling a motorcycle. Safe motorcycling takes balance, coordination, and good judgment. Obey traffic lights, signs, speed limits, and lane markings. Ride with the flow of traffic and leave plenty of room between your bike and other vehicles. Always check behind you and signal before you change lanes. Remember to ride defensively. The majority of multi-vehicle motorcycle crashes generally are caused when other drivers simply didn't see the motorcyclist. Proceed cautiously at intersections and yield to pedestrians and other vehicles as appropriate. You can increase your visibility by applying reflective materials to your motorcycle and by keeping your motorcycle's headlights on at all times, even using high beams during the day.

When spring is in the air, motorcycles are everywhere. Do you long for the freedom that comes with riding on the open road? Then it's critical to respect your machine and improve your skills throughout your lifetime. But that's only half the story. Motorists interested only in four-wheeled vehicles still have a major responsibility in keeping motorcyclists safe on the road.

The vast majority of vehicles on the road are not motorcycles. It's quite possible that as a car or truck driver you rarely think about motorcycles. "When motorcycles and other vehicles collide, it is usually the other (non-motorcycle) driver who violates the motorcyclist's right of way," according to a statement from NHTSA. "There is a continuing need to help other motorists 'think' motorcycles and to educate motorcyclists to be aware of this problem."

Motorcycles are relatively small and drivers don't see them. Drivers don't anticipate motorcycles' movements. The driver's view of the motorcyclist is obstructed, often by the vehicle's blind spots or other vehicles. Riders 50 and older made up 35% of all motorcycle fatalities in 2015, according to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety. So-called "re-entry riders," who rode in their 20s and decided to take it up again in their late 40s to 60s face additional challenges today: more traffic, more powerful bikes, more distracted drivers and diminished physical skills. Drive defensively, especially at intersections, where half of all collisions occur. Assume you are invisible to other motorists and position yourself to be seen. Be courteous; don't weave in and out of lanes, or ride on the shoulder or between lanes. Wear bright and/or reflective clothing including durable boots that cover the ankles. Remember we can't drive their vehicle for them so watch them closely.



RIDER EDUCATION




